9. A slight, rapid wavering in pitch used to add expression to a note.
11. A long-necked stringed instrument from Greece.
12. A French composer known for his calm, unusual piano pieces such as "Gymnopédie."
13. A composition where a melody is introduced and then imitated by other voices in turn.
15. A Russian composer known for his ballet "The Rite of Spring."
16. An electronic instrument played without being touched, using hand movements near two antennas.

1. An American composer known for blending classical and jazz styles, including "Rhapsody in Blue."
2. A stringed instrument played flat on a table or the lap, plucked or strummed.

3. A sliding movement from one pitch to another.
6. A keyboard instrument, ancestor of the piano, that plucks its strings rather than striking them.
7. Using all twelve notes within an octave, including every sharp and flat.
8. Plucking the strings of an instrument instead of using a bow.
10. An instrument whose name means "bell play" in German.
14. A repeated musical pattern that continues throughout a piece or section.
